I. MOTION

Move to approve the delegation of authority to the County Administrator to amend Lane County's contract with Family Relief Nursery in the amount of \$325,248 and execute the contract for a total of \$363,148.

II. AGENDA ITEM SUMMARY

Prior to the Oregon Legislature approving its budget for the 2007-2009 biennium the Department of Children and Families submitted an estimated allocation of \$151,600 for Relief Nursery services to the Family Relief Nursery (FRN) during Lane County's '07-'09 budget process. However, as a result of funding uncertainties during the finalizing of the State budget, we negotiated and executed a prudent contract with FRN in the amount of \$37,900, knowing that once the final amounts had been agreed upon by the legislature, that we would amend their contract. The final approved budget for FRN was \$363,148 so we are now submitting an amendment to the original contract of \$37,900 by adding \$325,248.

III. BACKGROUND/IMPLICATIONS OF ACTION

A. Board Action and Other History

The Board has typically approved funding allocations for Lane County's two relief nurseries either within the original county annual budget processes or on consent calendar as contracts and then amendments as more money has become available during the biennium.

B. Policy Issues

Funding for Lane County's two relief nurseries is directed and appears as a specific line item in the revenue agreement from the Oregon Commission on Children and Families OAR 423-010-0024(8).

C. Board Goals

The following Lane County's Goals are being addressed by this six-year prioritizing process:

• Ensure the provision of basic social support in the areas of health care, disease prevention, protection, poverty reduction and independent living.

 Ensure the public's safety with regard to adult and juvenile crime, emergency preparedness and regional cooperative policing through law enforcement, intervention, prosecution, incarceration, and parole and probation, while protecting individuals' constitutional rights.

D. <u>Financial and/or Resource Considerations</u>

This amendment will ensure that the Family Relief Nursery is able to serve many more at risk families, the original contract committed to serving 25 children. Healthy Start Clearinghouse and the Community Advisory Board are determining the total number of families to be served by the new allocation.

E. Analysis

Crisis Relief Nurseries

The Relief Nursery programs (located in Eugene and Cottage Grove), provide intensive family preservation and support services, including: a therapeutic early childhood program; a home visitation program; intensive parenting education; drug/alcohol treatment; child and family mental health services; special education services/support; respite, crisis response, parent meetings, support groups, and waiting list outreach. Improved Outcomes:

- > Child maltreatment rates: abuse, neglect and/or re-abuse rates
- > Adequacy of social support resources: informational, tangible, social & emotional
- > Quality of parent-child/youth interactions
- > Conflict resolution and anger management skills

F. Alternatives/Options

- 1. Approve delegation of authority to the County Administrator to amend Lane County's contract with the Family Relief Nursery in the amount of \$325, 248 and execute the contract for a total of \$363,148
- 2. Reject the Board order
