

# Criminal Law Research Guide

**GENERALLY:** The library has a wide variety of criminal law resources, geared both towards Oregon and federal law; and intended both for attorneys and self-represented litigants.

This guide is not intended to give you every resource but only to help you navigate the library and on-line resources.
