Lane County Sheriff's Office is Now recruiting CADETS

The Lane County Sheriff's Office is excited to announce a new Cadet Program for community members 18 to 21 years old who have an interest in law enforcement. The program is intended to mentor those who have a strong desire to serve their community but are not old enough to apply for a full time or Reserve deputy sheriff position, both of which require applicants to be 21 years of age or older.



The Cadet Program will provide an opportunity for participants to learn about various law enforcement careers and to develop the skills and knowledge necessary to prepare them for full-time employment with the Sheriff's Office. Successful applicants will be trained by deputy sheriffs in both patrol and corrections operations, and will serve at least 16 hours per month alongside full-time staff at the Sheriff's Office learning about what a career in law enforcement entails.

Space is limited so if you or someone you know is between 18 and 21 years of age and is interested in law enforcement now is the time to get involved!
