I. MOTION

MOVE THAT THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS RATIFY THE
COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR'S EXECUTION OF THE MEMORANDUM OF
UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN WOMESPACE, SPONSORS AND LANE COUNTY
ISSUE/PROBLEM

Womenspace Substance Abuse Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) Grant application will be received more favorably if a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is in place outlining collaborative roles should the grant funds be awarded.

II. DISCUSSION

A. <u>Background</u>

Womenspace applied for a 4-year SAMHSA Project Grant in the amount of \$350,000.

The SAMHSA Grant funds, if awarded, will provide trauma-informed support groups focusing on the co-occurrences of substance abuse, domestic violence victimization and criminal thinking.

Womenspace will provide the supervision and training to volunteers who will provide outstationed services at Sponsors, the Lane County Jail and Community Corrections Center (CCC).

Lane County (Jail and CCC) will provide facilities and access to individuals in the facilities. Specialized support and education groups will be held every other week with a

curriculum including exercises on domestic violence, addiction and criminal thinking. Additionally, we will participate in the Lane County Domestic Violence Council.

The MOU is a 4-year non-financial agreement with the option to extend the MOU if the SAMHSA Grant period is extended.

Immediate execution of the MOU was required 31 March 2006 due to application deadline being 1 April 2006.

B. Analysis

Lane County desires to collaborate with Womenspace in their effort to obtain grant funds to provide safety and recovery support services.

C. <u>Alternatives/Options</u>

- 1. Adopt the order to approve ratifying the Memorandum of Understanding.
- 2. Do not approve the order.

Memorandum of Understanding

WHEREAS, Womenspace (a non-profit organization), Sponsors (a non-profit organization), and Lane County by and through the Lane County Sheriff's Office (a political subdivision in the State of Oregon), have come together to collaborate and to make submit a proposal for a SAMHSA project grant; and;

WHEREAS, the partners listed above have agreed to enter into a collaborative agreement in which Womenspace will be the lead agency and named applicant and Sponsors, and the Lane County Sheriff's Office (Jail and Community Corrections Center) will be a partner in this application; and

WHEREAS, the partners herein desire to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding setting forth the services to be provided by the collaborative; and

WHEREAS, the application prepared and approved by the collaborative through its partners is to be submitted to the Substance Abuse & Mental Health Administration on or before April 1, 2006;

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby agreed by and between the partners as follows:

Womenspace, Sponsors and the Lane County Corrections Facility (Jail and Community Corrections Center) will collaborate to provide appropriate, trauma-informed support groups focusing on the co-occurrence of substance abuse, domestic violence victimization and criminal thinking as follows:

1. Womenspace will:

a) Employ domestic violence advocates with expertise in substance abuse issues and trained volunteers to provide out-stationed services at Sponsors, the Lane County Jail, and Community Corrections Center to perform the duties outlined in this grant application.

- b) Employ domestic violence advocates with expertise in substance abuse issues and trained volunteers on-site, on-call and off-site to community partners to perform the duties outlined in this grant application.
- c) Employ a domestic violence advocate with expertise in substance abuse issues to provided a community based support group and on-going services through the Womenspace Advocacy Center
- d) Participate in program development.
- e) Provide supervision and training of said advocates & volunteers
- f) Submit cost reimbursement requests for salary, services and costs within the parameters of the attached budget.
- g) Submit all agreed upon client statistics and client satisfaction surveys on a quarterly and annual basis for the duration of this grant.
- h) Participate in the Lane County Domestic Violence Council.
- 2. Sponsors and the Lane County Corrections Facility (Jail and Community Corrections Center) will:
 - a) Provide facilities and access to individuals in their facilities.
 - b) Participate in the Lane County Domestic Violence Council.

Each of the parties agrees to indemnify and save the other harmless from any claim, liability or damage resulting from any error, omission or act of negligence on the part of the indemnifying party, its officers or employees in the performance of its responsibilities under this agreement, subject to any applicable legal limitations.

To the extent applicable, the provisions of ORS 279B.220, ORS 279B.230, and ORS 279B.235 are incorporated into this agreement by this reference as though fully set forth.

Upon County's request and prior to beginning services at a Lane County Corrections Facility, Womenspace shall provide a certificate of insurance to Lane County, and agrees to maintain that coverage through the grant period.

This MOU is intended to be for a duration of four (4) years with the option to extend the MOU if the SAMHSA Grant period is extended.

Either party may terminate the MOU for no reason with 30 days notice.

Compensation for the contributions of Womenspace to this project will be provided as outlined in the attached budget detail. By signing here, each entity signifies approval of this collaboration including the proposed budget.
