COMMITTEE CHARGE: Advises the Board of County Commissioners on the status of civil and human rights in the County, and provides the Board of County Commissioners and County departments community input and feedback regarding human rights and affirmative action; provides community education and outreach through the recommendation, development, and implementation of human rights programs within Lane County; develops and publicizes a system to assist persons in seeking resolution of harassment and discrimination complaints and recommends appropriate action; recommends policies and actions to improve access to County services and employment opportunities, and for overcoming cultural, linguistic, and physical barriers which limit accessibility; provides an annual report to the Board of County Commissioners on the progress and condition of human rights in Lane County (including past activities, future goals and the number, type, and resolution of complaints); holds at least three (3) Committee meetings outside the Eugene/Springfield area utilizing city council meetings, community forums, and joint meetings with the Board of County Commissioners; develops a workplan annually for the upcoming year; affirms, encourages, and promotes programs and services designed to effectuate the spirit and intent of laws prohibiting discrimination and that recognize and value the cultural diversity of Lane County.
 - D. **BACKGROUND AND ANALYSIS:** The Lane County Human Rights Advisory Committee (LCHRAC) had two (2) vacancies that were left by employee members who resigned their positions. Staff to the Committee recruited for a new Lane County employee member in the fall of 2005 and received one application from Mr.

Martin. A panel of four (4), comprised of committee member Aaron Boyce, BCC liaison to the committee Commissioner Green, committee member Robert Weiss, and former staff liaison Laura Yergan, interviewed Mr. Martin and recommended his appointment to the committee. During their January 23' 2006 meeting, the committee will discuss how to target recruitment efforts for the remaining member positions and associate positions.

1. Give a brief description of the experience or training that qualifies you for membership on this advisory committee.

I have been practicing the profession of social work since I received my MSW from Portland State University in 1995. My social work experience has primarily been with disadvantaged clients who are mandated to sex offender treatment by the courts. I have worked with indigent and very low income male youth and both male and female adults. The populations I have worked with include the homeless, mentally ill, low IQ, gay-bitransgender, and racial minorities. I strive to treat all my clients with the dignity that is their birthright as human beings. I utilize a strengths-based approach to teach clients the skills necessary to manage their sexual behavior problems and to become more proactive in creating meaningful lives for themselves. I have worked as a Mental Health Specialist for Lane County Sex Offender Treatment Program since 2/99. My agency serves indigent and low-income adult male and female clients.

My interest in this committee stems from my belief that I owe more to this community than just working a 40 hour week with a difficult population. I hope to contribute my experience of working with and understanding marginalized populations in a forum designed to advise county government.
