I. MOTION

Move approval of the Order extending the current agreement for an additional three years.

II. AGENDA ITEM SUMMARY

In order to meet our obligations under our NPDES Phase II stormwater permit, Lane County partners with the City of Eugene to help fulfill requirements related to stormwater discharges in the areas between the city limits and the urban growth boundary.

Under the agreement, the City of Eugene handles construction and post-construction runoff control and assists us in public education and outreach and illicit discharge detection and elimination. Costs to provide these services are reimbursed to the city under the terms of the agreement

The term of the current agreement has expired and needs to be extended to insure uninterrupted service and compliance with our current permit.

III. BACKGROUND/IMPLICATIONS OF ACTION

A. Board Action and Other History

Through Board Order No. 03-3-12-4, the Board of County Commissioners authorized staff to enter into the agreement with the City of Eugene.

The agreement was executed in May 2004 and expired in February 2008. There have been two amendments to the agreement that have increased the total authorized amount not-to-exceed \$170,000.

This amount is an estimate derived from; 1) the estimated costs associated with the River Road/Santa Clara Stormwater Basin Plan,

2) production, administration, and distribution of educational brochures, and 3) actual costs beyond those collected from fees, fines and penalties for administration and enforcement of erosion and sediment control regulations.

The City has billed the County \$59,550 to-date under the agreement. There is no need to consider increasing the not-to-exceed amount at this time.

Staff is currently working on finalizing a draft Stormwater Master Plan for the River Road/Santa Clara Area as well as coordinating other stormwater related activities with the City of Eugene. The agreement is the basis of our relationship and is needed to continue it.

Staff is asking that the agreement be extended for another three years. All other terms and conditions of the original IGA and amendments will be in full force and effect.

IV. TIMING/IMPLEMENTATION

Upon approval, a third amendment will be drafted that extends the term of the agreement according to the Board's direction.

VI. RECOMMENDATION

Approve the order to amend the IGA to extend the expiration date for another three years.
