These carefully selected destinations include swimming pools, museums, golf courses, trampoline parks, bowling alleys, disc golf courses, indoor basketball, roller skating, miniature golf, and more.

The 1PASS is a personalized ID card with a unique QR code. Cardholders present and scan their card each time they visit a destination.

Mount Pisgah Arboretum

Whether you're looking for vigorous exercise, quiet contemplation, or a pleasant picnic, the Arboretum offers a beautiful natural retreat that is conveniently close to downtown Eugene and Springfield. Visitors come here to enjoy the natural world along our extensive network of trails, learn about local ecology in our nature walks and workshops, celebrate mushrooms and wildflowers at our annual festivals, and introduce children to the wonders of nature.

Group Tours

We have weekend walks that are geared toward families with children. We also provide guided walks for youth groups. We can tailor the focus and timing of the walk to the needs of your group. We can also schedule recurring walks for groups.

Camps

Our partners, Whole Earth Nature School, and Nearby Nature, run summer camps, spring break camps and no-school day programs at the Arboretum. These camps are a great way for kids to explore the Arboretum when school's out. Contact our partners directly to learn about camp opportunities!

ADMISSION There is no entry fee to the Arboretum, however Lane County Parks does require a \$5 parking fee for every vehicle (bicycles park free). You can purchase a day pass via a fee machine at the top of the parking lot, or an annual parking pass at our office.

Ridgeline Trail

Eugene's Ridgeline system rings the southern edge of the city with a series of large, semi-connected parklands. Valued deeply by the community for recreation, open space, and habitat values, the Ridgeline system is accessed through a network of over 12 miles of trail starting at seven main trailheads.

Spencer Butte, the city's highest point, crowns the Ridgeline at 2,058 feet in elevation. Other Ridgeline natural areas include Suzanne Arlie Park, Amazon Headwaters, Mt. Baldy, Blanton Ridge, Moon Mountain, South Eugene Meadows, and Wild Iris Ridge.

Directions

To get to the most popular trailhead at Spencer Butte: from the intersection of 29th and Willamette, go south on Willamette for 2.1 miles. At 52nd street, continue south on South Willamette for 1.2 miles. The parking lot entrance will be on your left at the sign for Spencer Butte Park.
